



EXPLORE

Youth-friendly employers offer young people the chance to explore different careers and industries through a range of activities including taster days, assemblies and careers fairs.

Working with schools, colleges, youth organisations and young people directly to open up the world of work.

EXPERIENCE

Youth-friendly organisations understand that young people benefit from a range of work experience opportunities. Work experience can take a variety of forms such as work shadowing and short work experience placements. These quality experiences must take place on employer sites and support young people to develop skills and understanding of the world of work.

EMPLOYMENT

Youth-friendly organisations offer a range of employment and training pathways for young people. These roles meet the highest standard of youth friendly employment and include training and development plans, support and fair opportunities.







A first-of-its-kind digital tool, allows employers to measure and monitor their current youth employment practice.

It will support employers to access the information, advice and guidance they need to grow the quality of their early talent interactions and programmes, particularly for young people from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Good Youth Employment Benchmark

Pilot findings

01

Creating strategy:

Employers are eager but lack clear strategies. Effective youth engagement needs time, investment, and a well-defined, systematic approach.

02

Connecting networks:

Employers use mediators and networks to engage young people, focusing on ages 13-19. Most lack targeted approaches and struggle to support NEETs

03

Committing to the future:

Employers value hybrid models but face challenges due to rising costs, skill shortages, and limited resources.

Benchmark materials support innovative opportunity creation.

04

Championing evidence and evalution:

Employers need support for robust design, evaluation and impact measurement.


Employment

From the completion of the Employment section it was clear that you are in the committing stage of good youth employment practices.



You offer three developed programmes - paid internships, Apprenticeships and Industrial placements.

It is positive to see that you provide support and feedback to unsuccessful candidates. Examples you have shared include advice and guidance on how to develop future applications and signposting to website/resources to improve career confidence and employability skills. It is also extremely valuable that young staff always have access to a coach/mentor by their training provider. Internally, you offer a buddy system (someone who was an apprentice themselves to provide more pastoral support). Well done on committing to youth friendly employment
